Welcome The Rev. Cheol Soon Park: Moderator of the 134th General Assembly

Cheol Soon Park came to Canada from Korea in 1983. He began his ministry at Kitchener-Waterloo Korean Presbyterian Church, before moving to his current charge, Toronto Korean Presbyterian Church, a thriving congregation of some 1500 souls. Over the last 20 years of ministry, Cheol Soon has served the wider church in various capacities: on the Committee on Church Doctrine, the Evangelism Committee, at the Centre for Asian-Canadian Theology and Ministry, and governing Board at Knox College, and as the clerk of Eastern

Han-Ca Presbytery. Cheol Soon has been married to Karen for 25 years. They have three children.

"I think we have been in survival mode for so long that we have become quite comfortable with it," Cheol Soon says. "The church's future depends on the leadership of the church. We should look back to realize what has been missing in the life of the PCC. And we should look around to see what is available to improve the situation and to get the energy back to the local congregation. Reflection may be a luxury for us. Concrete action is a mandate. The local church should be a place that makes a joyful noise and wakes up people's heart and minds. In order to achieve it, renewal of leadership is a pre-requisite."

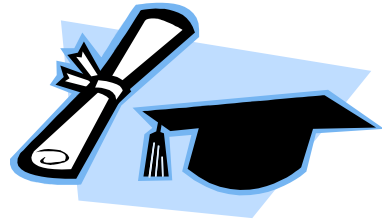
Friendship Luncheon
